

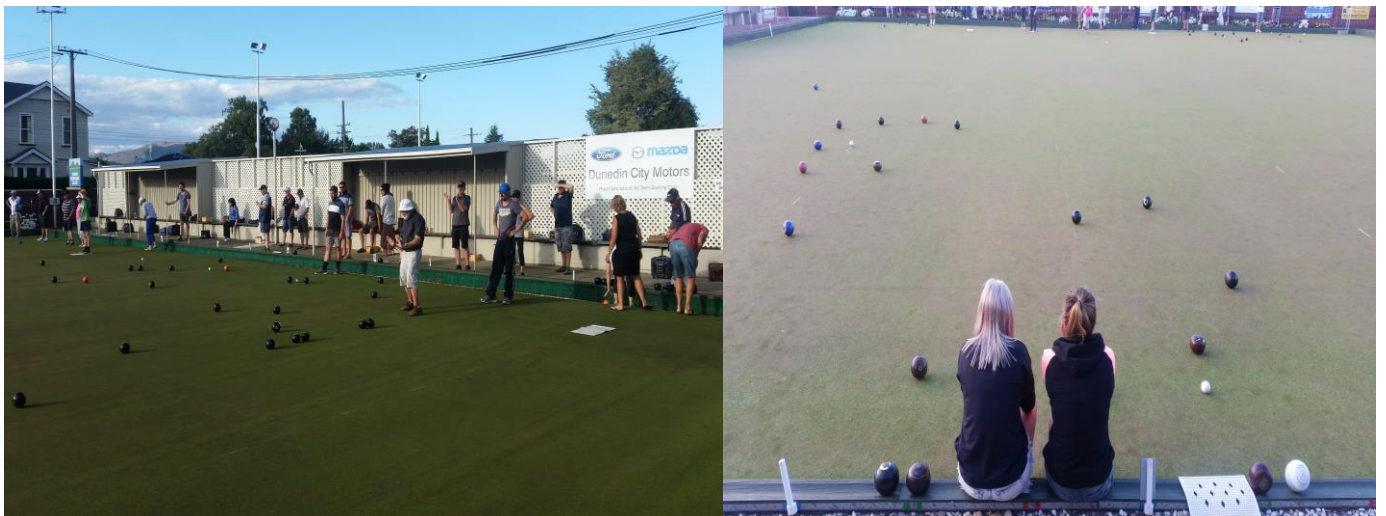

President's Report

When I took on the presidency last year I under estimated the demands my new business would make on my time. Not only did it prevent me from playing it also restricted the amount of time I could spend around the club on social or other matters. I missed that involvement and I won't allow it to happen again next season.

It has been an interesting year and the successes of our women need to be applauded. A high proportion of the Centre championships were won by Taieri women and later in the season Janet Swallow's fours team came agonisingly close to winning a national title. Well done ladies you had an outstanding year. The men's season was quiet in comparison. There were successes in centre and interclub events but not to the same overall extent as the women. For the second year in a row there were many weeks when the men's electors were faced with long lists of unavailable players, hopefully that won't be the case next year.

Early in the season two members of the Executive resigned and were subsequently replaced by Peter Andrews and Erik Ross. It disappoints me that we do not always appreciate each other and have not learnt to always work alongside each other. I have no doubt that the vast majority of members just want to enjoy being in the club and to enjoy playing bowls. The men's and lady's clubs co-existed very happily for decades and celebrated the other's strengths and successes. Strong wills do exist and although they can be very useful if harnessed positively but they can lead to an 'Us' and 'Them' attitude. That happened on occasions.

We are now one club.

There are many people who need thanking. Allan Swallow (Treasurer) has put a lot of time and thought into the club's finances over the past year and it has been a pleasure to work with him. Likewise, Jenny Dryhberg (Secretary) has performed her duties admirably and her minutes are of high quality. Among the other Executive members Vicki Graf has been an excellent and willing worker in her catering role and has been a wise voice at our meetings. I hope Vicki will make herself available for higher office. Lyn Hellyer (Lady's club captain) has attended most of our meetings and her input has been valued. Robert Gibson (manager and men's club captain) has performed his manager's duties well and continues to produce greens of a high standard. We also should acknowledge Robert's roles on the Centre's Operation's Committee and as president of New Zealand's Greenkeeper's Association. It isn't always easy for Robert who puts in long hours and is never really able to be 'off duty'.

Like many sports we face declining memberships and financial pressures. As Allan says in his report we have funds available but a long wish list of projects that need prioritisation. We have the best facilities on the Taieri and we need to maintain them. We are gradually attracting more and more groups that now quietly use our facilities during the week. We will soon be renovating the stadium with a repaint, new drapes, new carpet and new lighting. We are first and foremost a bowling club but our future depends on us opening our doors to broaden our financial base without forgetting our main purpose – Lawn Bowls.

I have decided to stand for President for another term but I do so in the knowledge that I need to structure my business to enable me to have more time. We have a good executive committee and we look forward to a successful, trouble free 2016 – 2017 season.

To the Ladies. Well done, enjoy your successes of last season and try to repeat those successes next season.

To the men. Make yourselves available for your club on Saturdays.

Make next season one to remember for all the right reasons.

My objectives over the last 12months were to continue to promote the club into the wider community of Mosgiel, maintain the level of funding received from donations from the Gaming Machine charities if possible, maintain the income streams created by Bar, Mates in Bowls, Sponsors, Tournaments, Hiring of facilities, function and increasing the catering and lifting the different levels of membership to name a few. The question is has this happened!! This has been alot more difficult over the last year and the club needs to consider its options with regard to these things.

Let's look at some of the comparisons of the different income streams over the last five years:

I want to thank **Dave Archer** for helping me throughout the summer as assistant greenkeeper. His learning after taking over from Lawrie has been steep but he has accepted the roll very well and learnt a lot about the processes for looking after two greens. We have both been learning because the new green is Cotula Maniototo and bottom green is Cotula Dioica and therefore have quite different requirements. We are producing greens consistently true and of similar speeds most days to allow you to play the game we love with the best conditions to allow to perform at your best consistently. Also want to thank Dave Howard our agronomist from NZ Sports Turf. I am currently President of the NZ Bowls Green keepers Assn and at this stage will be re-elected in July at The National Turf Conference in Auckland in late June. It continues to show our club is interested in making a difference in terms of the game of bowls New Zealand wide. Also President of the Dunedin Green Keepers Assn.

I want to thank the executive especially **Craig Sutherland** for giving me the freedom to do what I saw as some of the best ways to improve the overall running of the club on a day to day basis. This included improving the income streams we currently have and making them more and more profitable. Craig's accounting and business expertise has also been helpful and supportive. Also see the finance report.

I want to thank all our sponsors for recognising that the club is viable and successful and I sincerely hope that each and every sponsor feels that they get some mileage back either from the club in general or from its members supporting them. It is extremely important that we support those people and businesses that support us.

This club has a very large membership and of course not everybody will always be satisfied with all decisions made either by its executive or by how members conduct themselves. This club has amazing people in it and it supports its members extremely well. While we are trying to run the club as a **BUSINESS (gross income this last period \$308,000)** we still need to remember it's a sport, but the only way it can be successful going forward is to administer it as a business. Not many clubs would have that level of income on an annual basis. That requires help generally from all members e.g. selling raffles tickets, helping do bar where you can, helping doing catering where you can are examples that assist in keeping costs down by not having to employ outside people to do these jobs. (Some compensation is paid at times for help depending on function and number of hours required to be worked). If this doesn't happen then this may mean the executive decides to increase funds from elsewhere to support and fund the club i.e. increased subs!!! If you look at some of the fixed costs like rates, insurance, electricity and ongoing costs like repairs and maintenance of the club and surrounds funding needs to come from somewhere. The level of support from donations (mainly gaming grants) has dropped again over the last year and it means we have to work smarter to keep profitable and viable. The club is currently about to upgrade the stadium area to renovate mostly with new furnishings and paint and also replace the carpet. Just beginning to arrange funds from the quotes that are arriving in over last couple of weeks in June.

In saying all that I want to thank all those **PEOPLE** in the club who do all sorts of things (big and small) that go on unnoticed every day or week to ensure that this club has great facilities and are maintained at the highest level. We should be all extremely proud of how our facilities look. Numerous comments from non members of the club have been highly complementary and this only enhances our overall reflection within the community of Mosgiel. The greatest asset of this club is the people within the club who make it viable, successful and fun place to be. We always need volunteers to help create this environment. Unfortunately there are some people who still believe that this club, because it has a Manager, doesn't need its volunteers. The workload has grown to a level that far exceeds the original expectations and this means that all the members need to get behind the whole club to make sure it works!!!! Please assist if you can with anything you are able to. Whether it is in kitchen, bar, gardens, organising social events etc etc every little bit helps!!

Have you considered whether you can help by standing for the executive? This club **MUST** have the best people running the club. Remember my employment is to implement the ongoing decisions of the executive which should be around strategically focussed decisions for the future and not the day-to-day running of an organisation. The club must continue to drive forward to enhance the facilities, improve membership, upgrade current areas, and strive to improve the overall viability of the income streams. We cannot be seen to be selfish in terms by saying this is "**my club**" and therefore I want it always available when "**I**" want to be here. Maybe we should be trying to make it a community club for Mosgiel and **that might need a name change!!!!** Maybe this club can be a sports hub for this end of Mosgiel!!

A quick look at this year's profit and loss sheet shows a reduction in sales over 2015 with sales reducing from \$159,000 to \$150,000. This is a concern even though we have worked hard to get this excellent Club promoted as a function area by our Manager. Your new Executive needs to continue this and consider many options for making improvements in this area. The bar is our single most successful area for generating funds. If this continues to decline then our viability is at risk and **YOUR CLUB** may have to take some drastic measures that the members may not like. All income streams are extremely important because club members are using the club less and less now. Fridays nights and other times during the week are less and less patronised by club members and people are drinking less because of their age and also driving home means that they cannot drink as much.

We will be forced to pass on price increases each year in order to keep the margins where they need to be and we still continue to enjoy some of the lowest retail prices around.

We have received support from our suppliers Nellie's & Crofters and we would hope that the members return that support in whatever way possible.

On the member's behalf, a big *thank you* to all those bar persons who did an enormous job providing a high standard of service to members and guests. Those who have worked behind the bar have been happy to provide a service to the members and would hope that this facility has been operated in a way that pleases most. Often we struggle to find or get volunteers to work behind the bar for functions. If you can assist please give your name to me. It will mean that the same people will not be required to do it all!!!

We currently have club members now doing the bar stock takes and this is going extremely well. It also gives the system some integrity and assists in safe guarding those employees and volunteers that work behind the bar.

We are in the process of purchasing a new updated "Point of Sale" system and you will see new touch screen till within next week or so.

Greens Report

Once again Taieri was able to boast having two of the better greens in the Dunedin Bowling Centre. The greens played very well from October through to April with there being a couple of rinks that although different and perhaps a bit difficult were never the less playable.

My thanks go to Dave Archer who was employed as the assistant green keeper, after Lawrie Watson had to resign because of a bad back, to help me through the summer months maintaining a good playing surface throughout the season with judicious watering, mowing, and rolling of the greens. The McDonald green has continued to improve and work again was done in this autumn to try and improve even further. We will continue to learn about the requirements of having a maniototo surface. The bottom green will have some more done on the edges closer to the spring to try and reduce the inability to stop a bowls at the edge.

The Centre also utilised our greens and club for more fixtures than usual because of the good playing surfaces and facilities we were able to provide. It is a pleasure to have Centre and Regional events here and we hope that will continue into the new season. This next season we have applied for National Events as well.

Greens maintenance for the 2015/2016 season was grooving for the Wilkins Green to bring back the level of playing surface we are accustomed to in the new season. The McDonald Green was grooved as well this season but to a shallower depth and then lightly soiled with the fertiliser program as per the agronomist instructions.

The gardens were once again planted out along the fence line. These along gave a good showing and enhanced the surrounds of the club. The gardens do take a lot of looking after and I want to thank Colin Bowden specifically, assisted by Graeme Cousins for spending a lot of hours tending to them during the season. FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

Finance Committee Report

Committee Allan Swallow, Craig Sutherland and John Heller.

I am pleased in conjunction with Craig and John to present the Financial Report for the 2015/16 season.

It is disappointing to note that a cash loss of \$9,710 has been recorded and together with the required depreciation write down of \$11,749 and associated stock movements and adjustments that the total loss incurred was \$21,552.

The full trading position is outlined further in the report however I would summarise the year as follows.

As against the original budget projections (in brackets) the club's gross main revenue streams were Bar \$149,691 (\$155,000) Catering \$17,235 (\$38,000) Donations and Sponsorship \$25,060 (\$33,000) and Gaming Machine Income \$16,795 (\$23,000).

As can be seen all the major income streams were down on their gross (prior to costs) projections with the most disappointing result being incurred with the net external catering result of \$1,656. While accepting that the gross takings were below the budgeted figure, the net margin was well below expectations.

There are always some- one off items of expenditure that were not foreseen but generally the overall costs of the club during the 12 month period of \$171,218 were virtually as predicted of \$170,850.

As some of you may be aware one of the additional costs incurred was a figure of \$1,200 that the Executive agreed to provide to six players to attend the National Open Championships in Hamilton after their respective teams had qualified by winning the respective Dunedin Centre Open events.

The decision has been made wherever possible to financially support any player/s who wish to attend these events in the future and a figure of \$1,500 has been allowed as a Travel Fund in the forthcoming 2016/17 budget. Also in respect of the expenditure levels of the club one item that will not be incurred this coming season will be the cost of purchasing the Club jackets while we are still allowing for additional sales of these items. Finally within the expenditure for the season is a figure of \$5,440 which relates to manager's unpaid leave. While the Executive has agreed to make no further monetary payments in this respect, the unpaid leave is required to be shown as a contingent debt that the club has. This is also noted in the notes to the financial statements further in this report. Excluding this figure would reduce the cash loss to \$4,270 and overall deficit to \$16,112.

Any loss is disappointing and financial improvements can only be made by increased income levels, reduced expenditure or a combination of both to maintain a stable position going forward prior to any capital expenditure. The Club as at 31st March was fortunate in having \$54,393 in cash reserves but these must not be utilised in funding on going trading losses.

It is the Finance Committee's opinion that these funds must be utilised for the considerable amount of capital expenditure that is required within the Club and not rely on a four to five yearly top up in cash reserves incurred through past hosting of the Nationals and the huge amount of hard work by Club Members.

There has been a lack of deferred maintenance for many years and a list has been compiled and is included /attached within the Budget for the forthcoming season further in the financial report of the club.

These items include improving the surrounds around both greens and walkways, improve and relay the bottom (Wilkins) green, Sun and or Rain shelters for the bottom green, improved flood lights, replacement of the Bar Till and stock taking system, improved storage capabilities, an upgrade of the locker rooms, extension of the soil shed, a complete re-vamp and redecoration of the stadium, associated relaying of the stadium carpet, not to mention an upgrade of the kitchen including new dishwashers for both the kitchen and Bar.

All of these items have been initially priced out with a figure of \$200,000 able to be spent without too much difficulty so it will be a decision to be made by the Executive in order of priority and the amount of capital required able to be raised and also serviced and supported by the club's income streams.

Some grants will be applied for, however members should be aware, that in addition to the grants received and the utilisation of the Club's funds, then limited bank borrowings will be required. In addition to the cash funds shown in the report we do have a debenture within the Dunedin Bowls Stadium of \$10,000 which we may discuss the possibility of repayment to assist our capital works programme.

In summary, the matter of and the level of capital expenditure needs to be addressed as a priority by the new Executive being elected.

A budget has been prepared for the 2016/17 season which is enclosed with this report, and shows slightly increased income and reduced expenditure levels, both necessary to achieve a break even position.

This budget does provide for Repair and Maintenance (or limited capital expenditure) of \$10,000 but this is the minimum that should be spent when we have assets of way in excess of \$1m

I wish to thank both Craig and especially John for their support and accounting expertise provided to me over the past year and also Robert for his preparation of the monthly Management Reports.

Finally I would like to extend a special thanks to James Aitken for his work in continuing to externally review the club's financial affairs.

If there are any questions in respect of the financial affairs of the club, then either myself, Craig, or John will be pleased to discuss them with you either prior to or at the Annual General meeting.
